### English

This term's text is Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. The children will be exploring the text through reading techniques—giving them a deeper understanding and love of what they are reading. It will also be a stimulus for our writing by using the information from the book to write our own persuasive piece for a brand new chocolate factory. In addition, we will be recounting our trip to the Chocolate Story in York and explaining the way chocolate gets from farms to factories.

The second part of the term will include narrative writing from the book and an in depth look into how fair trade impacts the global trade market.

### Maths

The National Curriculum expects all children from Year 4 to know all of their times tables up to and including 12. Does your child know them?

- The children will continue to develop their understanding of the four operations and place value.
- \* Fractions
- Money—including addition and subtraction
- \* Measure
- \* Shape

Basic skills will continue to be a cornerstone of our maths lessons to ensure the core skills learnt throughout school are not forgotten.

### Our themed work for Spring 1 is Chocolate—from bean to bar



### <u>Science</u>

<u>Plants</u>

The class will be developing their learning from key stage 1 on plants. They will be exploring the functions of key parts of flowering plants and understand what plants need to grow effectively.

They will then investigate how water is transported and the role of the flower in the life cycle of a plant.

### Homework

We will be sending out either maths or English homework on a weekly basis with some other creative homework occasionally given. This will be given on a Friday and will be required to be handed in on a Wednesday.

We also have a goal of ALL children reading at least 3 times a week—this could be reading to an adult or reading independently. We do ask that you sign your child's reading record even if they read independently. Your support with this is hugely important

### Computing

We will be continuing to develop key computing skills this term through using a variety of programs.

Furthermore, we will how to write our own programs and how to debug them.

As the internet is such a prominent tool, Children will learn how to remain safe online and use search engines to support their research.

### RE

The children will be spending this term learning about how and why religious people pray with comparisons observed between religions.

The second half of the term will focus on Easter and ways in which this is celebrated.

### History, Geography and Art & Design

Throughout this term, children will have a focus on geography skills. They will continue their understanding of how to use an atlas and explore areas where food comes from. They will continue to improve their knowledge of the wider world by comparing farming conditions both here and in poorer countries.

Our artwork will focus on the style Quentin Blake uses in his illustrations of Roald Dahl texts before moving onto how shadow is used. This will be through studying the work of Paul Cezanne.

Children will also get the opportunity to design their own chocolate packaging through computer design. They will research effective packaging and consider how they can make theirs appealing to an audience.

### Our themed work for Spring 2—The impact of fair trade



### Science Animals including humans

Children will learn about the digestive system and the stages our food goes through when we eat.

Following this, they will construct a variety of food chains and identify producers, predators and prey.

### <u> P.E.</u>

The children will take part in P.E every Monday.

- This term the focus will be on net games and health and fitness
- They will develop their physical, thinking and social skills throughout their learning

It is important that all earrings are removed before the session.

If your child cannot remove them, they must be removed before school.

### <u>PSHE</u>

Although PSHE is a nonstatutory subject, at Lingdale we know that personal, social, health and emotional education is Vital.

- \*PSHE is ongoing and is often addressed through specific lessons as well as aspects of other subjects.
- \* Across the year, we will explore anti-bullying, mental health, and family issues.

All of these issues are addressed delicately with the support of Mrs Stephenson.

### French

Children will be having a French lesson every week where they will be learning key phrases and vocabulary. They will also experience reading and listening to French stories and singing popular songs to develop their understanding of a modern foreign language.

### Music

Recorder lessons will continue this term and the children will learn how to play ukulele. Each class listens to music every morning with a different theme each half term. In Spring 1, the theme is folk music.
