## WHAT HAPPENS IF MY CHILD BECOMES UNWELL IN SCHOOL or SHOWS SYMPTOMS?

You will be notified immediately to come and collect your child. Your child will be escorted to a safe space with a member of staff to await your arrival.

### WHAT HAPPENS IF SOMEONE TESTS POSITIVE FOR COVID 19 at Lingdale Primary School ?

You will have noticed in the press that a number of local schools have reported a positive test result. In the event of this happening at Lingdale, you will receive one of two letters. 1. If your child is not in the bubble of the person who has tested positive, they will continue to attend school.

2. If your child is in the bubble of the person who has tested positive, they will need to isolate for 14 days. Home schooling will resume. Siblings from different bubbles do not need to isolate. If they do not develop symptoms, they will return to school after a fortnight. If they do develop symptoms, they will need to have a test. If the result is negative, they can return to school right away. If the result is positive, they need to inform school and follow NHS guidelines remaining fully isolated.

The symptoms of Covid are:

- A high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature);
- A new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or three or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual);
- A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal.
