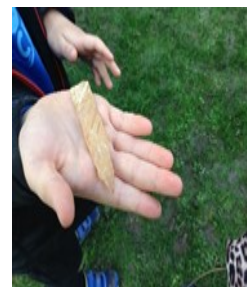

What a fantastic week our Year 3 & 4 class have had. Not only did they get the opportunity to plant bulbs around the village, they also had a visit from the North York Moors National Park. The children were able to experience what life might have been like during the Stone Age period. The morning began by learning how different trees were used during that era and how to recognise them by looking at their leaves. The class were able to handle actual artefacts from the Stone Age and make predictions what they were used for; tying in perfectly with their in class learning. Following this, the children had to use the resources around them to build a shelter that the whole group (8 people) could fit under and be protected from the elements. Finally, they learned how to light a fire by creating sparks. The whole class thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

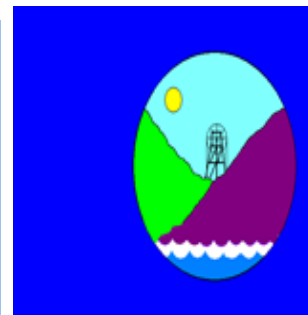
