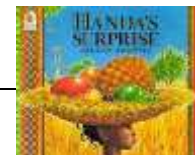

Story:

This week's story is called Handa's Surprise.

Discussion

Looking at the pictures can you discuss where Handa lives?
How can you tell this from the pictures?
Discuss the similarities and differences between where Handa lives and where you live
What is your favourite fruit? Can you draw a picture of it?

Use the cut and stick pictures to make character puppets.
Can you put on a puppet show to retell the story to your family?



Understanding of the world

Handa's Surprise is set in Kenya - can you find Kenya on a map? Is it far away from where you live? What can you find out about this country?

Physical Development:

Fruit Salad: Could you have a go at cutting up some fruit to make a healthy fruit salad? Or you could thread the fruits onto sticks and make fruit kebabs.

Make sure an adult is with you to keep you safe. Don't forget to wash your hands carefully.



Be active: Balance a basket- How easy is it to walk carrying something on your head? Using a small basket with a few soft items, or a cushion, children can practice walking without holding their load on their heads. This can become a game, with someone trying to take an item without being noticed.

Fine Motor:

- Practise threading this week with the cards and string sent home in your packs.
- Use the scissors skills activity in this pack. Cut out the animals and the fruits. Can you match the animals to the fruits they pinched and glue them together in your books?
- You could paint and thread pasta onto some string to make an African necklace.



Letters and sounds:

This week there are two sets of challenges for your children to develop their listening and help them tune into sounds they hear.

We focus on body percussion activities this week - please see the challenge sheets in your pack.

The other group continue to develop their understanding of rhythm and rhyme - please see the challenge sheet in your pack.

Also in your pack this week is an activity called I spy. Please use the sheet to play eye spy to help children develop their hearing of initial sounds.

We will also send links for some other letters and sounds activities at the children's different levels through Marvellous me this week.

Maths

Number of the week : 4

Have a look through your toy vehicles. Do any of them have 4 wheels? Count carefully. Do any of them have a different number of wheels? Ask a grown up or older sibling to make you a big number 4 road! This could be with chalk, tape or on paper. Choose a vehicle to drive along the road to practise writing the number 4.

For an added challenge you could count out 7 pieces of fruit like the fruits from the story and take one away each time. How many are left?

Creative:

Can you make an African necklace for Akeyo? You could use paints and paper plates ...

You could make the different shaped fruits from the story with your playdough.

With an adult, choose some fruit from your house and do some fruit printing.

You could also make Handa's basket using glue and tissue paper. Collage the different fruits onto her basket with some resources from your pack.



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
