Years Three and Four have shown amazing resilience and drive throughout this half term. They have worked tirelessly to improve their skills across the whole curriculum.

All of the children have been really engaged in our topic of Ancient Egypt - even designing and making shadufs (a device to collect water from the Nile) in their D.T. lessons. Alongside this, they have learnt about light and explored the changing sizes of shadows - undertaking a range of investigations. They are now becoming experts at Scratch programming developing their knowledge of how computers work and how we use code to instruct computers differently to how a human would be instructed. This has been topped off with weekly visits from the MFC Foundation and a couple of sessions with the Fire Brigade. We are incredibly proud of all their hard work and long may it continue.






