Participation is one of the four General Principles of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child and is a theme which runs through the whole Convention, but there are two articles we are focusing on this week:



Article 12 - Respect for the views of the child

Every child has the right to express their views, feelings and wishes in all matters affecting them, and to have their views considered and taken seriously. This right always applies, for example during immigration proceedings, housing decisions or the child's day-to-day home life.

Article 13 - Freedom of expression

Every child must be free to express their thoughts and opinions and to access all kinds of information, as long as it is within the law.





A visit from Simon Clarke

Yesterday, Head boy Logan, Head girl Maddie and Deputy Head boy Harley D met Mr. Clarke and his private secretary Miranda at the front of school and escorted them to our school council meeting. Simon Clarke introduced himself to the children and explained that he is Chief Secretary to the Treasury and part of the Cabinet. He is MP for Redcar and Cleveland and works half of the week in Westminster. Our school council explained that they were also voted democratically onto the council and how our school is very focused on British Values. The children explained in depth what the values are and how they are included in the school day and curriculum. Riley explained about debates which are held regularly where everyone has a voice, an opinion and a vote at the end.

The school council discussed our community and Sonny went on to explain why our the council are particularly concerned about road safety in Lingdale. He pointed out how unsafe it is for children to cross Stanghow Road to get to "the track". Riley suggested to Mr Clarke that a zebra crossing without traffic lights would be useful in Lingdale. Harley pointed out that school have been asked by the Little Moorsholm Green Fingers Group to help make "the track "prettier with plants and encourage wildlife and he put the question "What is the point of that if its not safe to go there?".

Mr Clarke thanked the children for their commitment to keeping themselves safe and their very valid questions and suggestions. He said that he is going to send a letter to Redcar and Cleveland Council Road Engineers for their suggestions, as they may have other options. He is also going to write to Cleveland Police about their thoughts on the safety of this road. As soon as he has any information he will contact School Council with updates.
