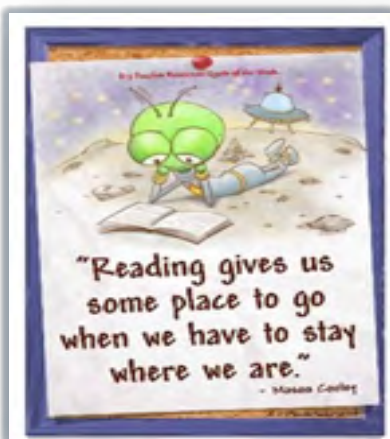
Rugby Stars

A message from the Chair of Governors

Lingdale School is at the centre of the community and plays an important part in the life of Lingdale. As living costs are increasing daily, I would encourage families to make use of our FREE breakfast club. The FREE breakfast club is funded by Greggs Bakery, which is available every morning from 8:15am and for those who start work early we are able to provide a breakfast club from 7:30am for a small charge of £1.00 per day. Greggs also offer funding for those families who are struggling. They can support with clothing and food vouchers and offer our school support helping families who may need new white goods e.g washers, beds, fridges, freezers etc. If you are struggling, then please speak to Mrs Thornton ASAP as we are always here to help.

The rapidly rising fuel costs was also a major concern for governors as we started the new term. Rough calculations show that our gas and electricity bill could increase by £20000 this year. Fortunately the government has announced help with energy costs for schools. Exact details are not yet available but we hope it will allow us to use our budget educating your children to make them "the best that they can be". **John Whitehead Chair of Governors.**
