

School Procedures due to Inclement Weather Guidance - Parent Copy 2022/23

In the event of inclement weather, we will try our best to maintain service as normal for you.

We really appreciate your patience and support in this matter.

Once school is open for the day, we will remain open.

Should heavy snowfall occur during the day and you are concerned about getting your child home safely, then you are welcome to collect your child early.

* The health and safety of everyone who comes onto our site is of the utmost priority.*

Arrangements for dropping off and collection of children will mean that parents and children will use the main entrance ONLY. The steps will remain closed. At the end of the school day we ask you to enter the site with caution and stay within the identified front path, socially distancing safely.

Staff will be available on the school site as soon as they can get in. Parents can contact school directly by email or telephone.

SCHOOL CLOSURE

In the event of extreme inclement weather, such as heavy snowfall over night and anticipated continuation into the next day, we will follow the procedures below:

- The decision to open/ close the school will be made by the Headteacher by 7
 a.m.
- The announcement for closure or a late start to the school day will be made on our school Facebook page and emailed to parents by 7.15am.
- Please listen for announcements on BBC Radio Tees, TFM, Magic & Radio Zet-land from 7.30 a.m.

In the event of snowy weather, children need to come to school in wellies or boots, as we will take the children outside to enjoy the snow if there is no compacted ice and they have a change of footwear.

If ground conditions are slippery, the site supervisor will endeavour to clear and grit a route. We ask you not to walk on flooded or untreated surfaces and to please be careful, allowing a little extra time to arrive at school safely, both on the paths leading to and from school and everywhere on our site.







Update December 2022

We have been informed that 4 children who attend Lingdale Primary School, have <u>scarlet fever</u>. We have no confirmed cases of Strep A. This letter offers some further information and advice about this, which you may find useful.

What are scarlet fever and Strep A?

Scarlet fever is caused by bacteria called Group A streptococci (Strep A). The bacteria usually cause a mild infection that can be easily treated with antibiotics.

In very rare occasions, the bacteria can get into the bloodstream and cause an illness called invasive Group A strep (iGAS).

What are the symptoms of Strep A/scarlet fever?

- Sore throat
- Headache
- Fever
- A fine, pinkish or red body rash with a sandpapery feel
- On darker skin the rash can be more difficult to detect visually but will have a sandpapery feel

If a child becomes unwell with these symptoms, contact your GP practice or contact NHS 111 (which operates a 24/7 service) to seek advice.

If a child has scarlet fever, they MUST stay at home until at least 24 hours after the start of antibiotic treatment to avoid spreading the infection to others.

General hygiene advice

The spread of most infectious illnesses is reduced through good hand hygiene. Please help your child to wash their hands frequently with warm water and soap, particularly after using the toilet, after using a tissue to catch a cough or sneeze, and before eating. Particular care should be taken when handling nappies or tissues.

Any soiled clothes, bedding and towels should be washed on the hot cycle of a washing machine and where possible cups, utensils, towels and bedding should not be shared. School have increased hand washing routines in school. We have also asked cleaning staff to increase the cleaning of touch points and there will be a deep clean next week.

Medical advice

Most of the common viruses that affect children do not cause serious illness. However, if you are worried about the condition of your child, because, for example they have:

- A rash
- An unremitting fever
- Profuse diarrhoea and vomiting
- · Bloody diarrhoea
- Appear drowsy
- Display difficulty breathing
