

## Geography Curriculum EYFS to Year 6



## Intent:

As Geographers at Lingdale Primary School, our children will develop the skills to navigate and engage with the world they live in. We aspire to teach them about their home, address, school, village and locality. They will learn about the impact that human and physical geography has and will continue to have on their local area. We want them to know "What is on their doorstep?" as well as having an appreciation of life in other parts of the UK and other cultures around the world- with settlement being at the heart of the curriculum.
