## <u>English</u>



Our focused text this half term in the true story of Phillippe Petite- The Man Who Walked Between the Towers. Children will continue to focus on predicting and summarising, making and justifying inferences and explaining how meaning is enhanced through a choice of words and phrases.

We will explore the art of writing a newspaper report using direct and reported speech and how to lure the reader in.

Spelling tests will continue on a Monday morning-starting 16th with words given out on the 9th.

## Maths

The National Curriculum expects all children from Year 4 to know all of their times tables up to and including 12. Does your child know them? Are they accessing TTRS at home still?

## Spring

We will continue to follow the White Rose scheme of work. All pupils will focus on multiplication and division, fractions, decimals and percentages, area and perimeter and statistics.

Year 6 pupils will also learn about ratio and scaling, volume and algebra.

Arithmetic will remain a top focus for all children.

## Our Geography focus for Spring 1 is

Geographical skills and fieldwork -using maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe features studied. Use the eight points of a compass, four and six-figure grid references, symbols and keys (including the use of Ordnance Survey maps) to build their knowledge of the United Kingdom and the wider world. Use fieldwork to observe, measure, record and present the human and physical features in the local area using a range of methods, including sketch maps, plans and graphs, and digital technologies.

## <u>Science</u>

## Forces

Explain that unsupported objects fall towards the Earth because of the force of gravity acting between the Earth and the falling object

Identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction, that act between moving surfaces.

Recognise that some mechanisms, including levers, pulleys and gears, allow a smaller force to have a greater effect.

> Who was Sir Isaac Newton? Who was Galileo Galilei?

Homework/Reading All pupils in years five and six will be given

one piece of homework a week. This will be given out on a Thursday and expected back on the following Tuesday. Homework club will be available for any child needing support on a Monday breaktime. Home reading also plays an integral part of homework.

At Lingdale, pupils are encouraged to read at home to an adult on a daily basis. We are insisting that Children read and return their reading diary at least 3 times a week. They will then be entered into the weekly book draw. Thank you in ad-Vance for your support with this- hearing your Child read a few pages- or paragraphs and asking a couple of questions to Clarify their understanding is Vital

## Computing

Children will be continuing to develop their Computing skills this term to be an active part of the digital world we live in.

Computing is broken into 3 areas: Computer science, digital literacy and information technology. Our focus will cover all three areas this term.

- Email (digital literacy)
- Spreadsheets (information technology)
- Game Creation (Computer science)
