Communication and Language

- Developing listening skills
- Answering simple questions about a story
- Learning familiar rhymes and songs

- Manipulating objects with good control
- Moving in different ways
- Developing pencil control and grip



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Gaining independence when choosing where to play
- Tidying up resources when finished
- Building positive relationships with adults and peers
- Following classroom routines and boundaries

<u>Literacy</u>



- Joining in and exploring simple stories and rhymes
- Exploring mark making techniques

Understanding the World

- Naming and describing familiar people
- Using their senses to explore
- Talking about autumn
- Sharing news and remembering special times shared with their friends

<u>Mathematics</u>



- Compare sizes using gestures and language: 'bigger/little/small'
- Talk about and explore 2D shapes
- Join in with number songs

Expressive Arts and Design

- Using story telling in role play
- Using a range of techniques
- Experimenting with colour
- Exploring different sounds

Our focus stories this term are "The Colour Monster", "Goldilocks and the Three Bears", Whatever Next" and "The Gruffalo's Child". The children will have opportunities to engage in a range of themed activities and provision areas. We will then look at seasonal changes and talk about autumn. We will also be learning about celebrations including Halloween, Diwali, Bonfire Night and Christmas. Children have daily access to the outdoor area so please ensure your child wears appropriate clothing when the weather becomes colder. We can provide children with a pair of wellies and waterproof clothes when needed. **Please ensure all clothing is clearly labelled with your child's name.**
