Homework & Reading



Reading with your child at home is a crucially important way to support their learning. Reading books together, reading to your child and hearing them read are all key ways to will help your child to develop into an able reader and writer.

We expect to see your child's 'Home Reading Diary' in school every day. We ask that children read at home each night. They will be entered into a prize draw on a Friday if they have **read** three times or more at home.

Just a reminder that the home loan shed is outside out classroom door. We need to leave the doors shut during the Winter months but feel free to open the shed to swap books whenever you want to. We just ask that you use the peg system so that we can keep track of who has which books. Thank you.

The importance of reading Research shows that reading to your child and listening to your child read for just 15 minutes every day significantly helps to develop:

- Speaking & listening skills
- Spelling
- Reading comprehension
- Vocabulary



Maths English Science

Year 1

In English this term year one children will be focusing on applying phonics they have learnt to their spelling of words and building sentences with capital letters and full stops. Year two children will be focusing on writing accurate sentences with correct punctuation. They will also be learning to add adjectives and use imperative verbs.

Children will be writing short sentences/poems about playing in the snow whilst we read Hungry Caterpillar's First Winter. They will also be learning to write instructions about how to build a snow creature. Later in the term children will be writing simple recounts.

In our Science lessons, children will be learning about seasonal change this half term. They will learn to name the four seasons and talk about their features and associated weather patterns. Next half term, children will be learning about the parts of a plant and what they need to grow and survive.

History

In History, children will be learning about the Neil Armstrong and the first Moon landing. They will learn about his journey to the Moon and how he was the first person to walk on the Moon. The children will also be learning about how Space travel has changed over time.



Geography

In Geography, children will be comparing their local village to a contrasting location. They will learning about a village in an African country and learning to make simple comparisons.

DT/Art

Children will be learning about textiles and using templates and different joining techniques. Children's Art project this half term is Woven Wonders. Children will be learning the art of weaving and completing

Computing

In computing, children will be introduced to programming and they will begin to use simple codes to program a robot on the computer. They will also be completing online safety lessons and creating digital pictures.

SMSC

The theme this term is 'Dreams and Goals.' Children will be talking about their hopes and future. After half term, children begin to talk and learn about being healthy.

R.E

During R.E lessons children will be learning about why the Bible is special to Christians and why they celebrate the Festival of Easter.

P.E

British Values

In P.E children will be practising their skills in Dance. After half term they will continue to develop their team building and ball skills. Children will be learning about the five British values.

We will focus on the themes of respect and tolerance this term.
