Letters went out this week offering places. We hope the children take up these opportunities,

English

We will be diving into the book "Darwin's Dragons by Lindsay Galvin this term. Set in 1835, it tells the journey of Cabin boy Syms who falls overboard whilst on a voyage to The Galapagos Islands with the world-famous scientist Charles Darwin. The children will be writing travel blogs and brochures as well as designing their own imaginary creature from this remote part of the world.

In Summer 2, we will be creating our own Villainous Character after reading Inside The Villians by Clotilde Perrin.

Reading with prosody will continue to be a focus.

Maths

The National Curriculum expects all Children from Year 4 to know all of their times tables up to and including 12. Does your child know them?

Do they use TTRS at home?

Years 5 and 6 will start the summer term by studying shape. They will learn how to use degrees, classify angles and become confident in the use of a protractor to measure and draw angles.

In Summer 2 the Y6 pupils will be set a Challenge of designing and making things to sell at the summer fayre. They will learn about profit and loss and marketing.

Our Geography focus for Summer is studying the River Tees. The children will work as geographers using fieldwork investigations such as research, observation, measurement and recording.

Science

We will finish our unit on Living things and Their Habitats before moving onto our final unit which will be Animals Including Humans.
Children will describe the changes as humans develop to old age. They will discuss growth and development including the changes experienced in puberty. This links in with our PHSE scheme of work. More information to follow.

Homework/Reading

All pupils in years five and six will be given one piece of homework a week. This will be given out on a Thursday and expected back on the following Tuesday. Homework club will be available for any child needing support on a Monday breaktime. Home reading also plays an integral part of homework. At Lingdale, pupils are encouraged to read at home to an adult on a daily basis. We are insisting that Children read and return their reading diary at least 3 times a week. They will then be entered into the weekly book draw. Thank you in advance for your support with thishearing your Child read a few pagesor paragraphs and asking a couple of questions to Clarify their understanding is vital

Computing

Online safety is an integral part of being a digital citizen, and to this end, we have a dedicated online safety lesson every half term.

This term we will be looking at how being online can affect our health and well- being and ways to ensure it is a positive experience.

In the main computing lessons, we will be completing our work on spreadsheets by developing our understanding of using formula.

In the second half of the term, we will be using Microbits to do some physical programming creating a functional tool that can be used as a pedometer through programming a device.

<u>RE</u> Christianity

What do Christians believe about God? How and why do Christians celebrate Pentecost? How do Christian groups differ in their expression of faith?

Grammar and Spelling

New spellings will continue to be given out every Monday with tests taking place on a Friday. We encourage children to learn the rules (and exceptions) around spellings as well as being able to confidently count the syllables in a word.

Year Six Sponsored Spell will take place in week 2 of Summer 1

Children MUST be secure with the basics of grammar-please, when reading and spelling with them—ask them to tell you the job of the word in the sentence.

Eg barked= regular past tense verb/ swam- irregular past tense verb might, may, shall, shan't— modal verbs hastily, gingerly, anxiously—adverbs in a silent fashion, in a flamboyant manner— adverbial phrases

We will be focusing on how to edit and improve sentences using a range of enhanced punctuation including ellipses, semi colons and brackets.



ART

Sculpture and 3D

Children will look at the style of the artist Joseph Cornell who made 3D art from objects with personal meaning assembled in a box..

This is known as Assemblage art.
