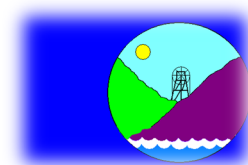

«Jewellery should be kept to a minimum— plain studs and a watch only.

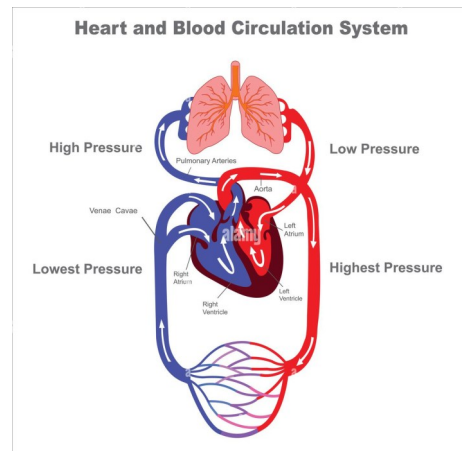


# What will my child be learning this term?

This term, we will be diving into a range of engaging topics! In English, our focus to start with will be non-fiction, focusing on Wolves. The children will be using non-chronological features to create a report on Wolves. They will then move onto some narrative writing and exploring various genres, including fantasy and adventure stories. Students will also develop their comprehension skills through reading a variety of genres and texts. I encourage you to support your child by reading together at home, discussing the storylines and characters, as this greatly aids their understanding and enjoyment.

In Maths, we will be covering multiplication and division before moving onto fractions, decimals and percentages.

Our Science topics this term revolves around animals including humans and the focus will be circulatory system. We have some exciting practical activities planned and I am sure the children will thoroughly enjoy this hands-on learning approach.



## History

Turning our attention to history, we will be beginning an exciting unit on the Anglo-Saxons. The children will learn about life in Anglo-Saxon Britain, including settlements, daily life, beliefs and the impact this period has had on our country today.

# Geography

In geography, we will be focusing on Iceland and exploring what makes it known as the *land of ice and fire*. The children will learn about Iceland's unique physical features, including glaciers, volcanoes, geysers and hot springs, and how these shape the landscape and way of life.
