Entrance into the camp costs £4.00 and the cost of the coach is £-. We appreciate your donations which ensure your child receives the broadest and richest of experiences.



## 2019 SATs


SATs Week 2019  
Monday 13th - Friday 18th May

Although it may seem a long way ahead, we all know how quickly time flies by and wanted to inform you of these important dates. From day one, your child will be working upon strengthening their current knowledge in order to achieve their full potential. We understand that this can be a trying time for some. However, staff will endeavour to provide every opportunity possible to support the children. Our only requirement is that they do their best and try hard. No more can be expected.

## English

Across the term, we will be delving into Michael Morpurgo's 'War Horse' which will provide an insight into World War I and the historical perspectives it provides. We will be using this text as a stimulus to write our own stories and explore the unique bond between Joey and Albert. We will debate the use of animals in wars and expect some heated exchanges!

GPS (grammar, spelling and punctuation) is a huge part of our Y5/6 curriculum and we will begin by consolidating past elements before introducing higher-level terminology such as *modal verbs*, *past progressive* and *determiners*.



## Maths

The National Curriculum expects all children from Year 4 to know all of their times tables up to and including 12. Does your child know them?

- \* This term we will continue to build on our rapid recall of all the times tables (practise makes perfect!) along with squared and cubed numbers.
- \* We will focus initially on place value and basic arithmetic skills- although we are aware that there are many gifted mathematicians amongst us so a high level of challenge will always be maintained.
- \* Children will need to apply efficient methods to increasingly complex and lengthier prob-

## History, Geography and Art + Design

Over the next term, we will be looking into answering many of the questions already posed by the children to help them gain historical perspectives and understand historical concepts.

Your child will be involved in many new learning experiences:

- \* Researching the causes of the wars and discovering who the true heroes were.
- \* Exploring life as a soldier, in particular trench warfare.
- \* Understanding significant events such as the Blitz and the Battle of Britain.
- \* Creating their own battleground/Blitz images.
- \* Designing and creating their own Anderson shelters.

## PSHE


Although PSHE is a non-statutory subject, at Lingdale we know that personal, social, health and economic education is vital.

- \* PSHE is ongoing and is often addressed through specific lessons as well as aspects of other subjects.
- \* Across the year, we will explore anti-bullying, mental health, and family issues. All of these issues are addressed delicately with the support of Mrs Stephenson.

## Science Animals + their Habitats

Our children will be exploring how living things are classified into broad groups according to characteristics and based on similarities and differences.

Children will be taught how to give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics.
