Filled with awe and wonder, the children were amazed to see such an unusual creature. Our new pet dragon provided us with lots of fun and interest for all our learning this half term. Scientists

Across upper Key Stage 2 we have been looking at fair testing and investigations over time. One of our investigations was to "Mummify" an orange. We followed instructions to carefully remove the insides of the orange from a small slit. We then absorbed the remaining fluid up with kitchen roll before filling them with a mixture of bicarbonate of soda, salt and cloves. Finally, we wrapped them in crepe bandages and placed them in a dark place for two weeks. Today we uncovered them for the first time. We observed many changes to shape, colour, and texture. We have rewrapped them and will look again after the Easter holidays.

Following an amazing contribution from the children in the form of their own rainforest designs, Year 3 & 4 have been focussed on learning about deforestation this half term and how the ever-increasing amount of trees being felled is damaging our planet.
