English

We will be linking our writing heavily with our topic of Ancient Egypt. At the start of term, we will be focussing on diary writing and taking on the role of a builder who is building the pyramids. Following this, we will be exploring the death of Tutankhamun and Howard Carter—the person who discovered his tomb and writing a biography. After the half term holiday, we will be writing our own stories that are set in the Ancient Egyptian period.

We will also look at different types of poetry and have a go at writing our own.

Reading will be centred around the topic as well with a focus on identifying question types and using different techniques to get a deeper understanding of texts.

Maths

The National Curriculum expects all Children from Year 4 to know all of their times tables up to and including 12. Does your child know them?

A lot of this term will be revisiting areas of maths and covering the areas we haven't explored yet which includes the following areas:

- Multiplication and division
- Shape—area and perimeter
- Time
- Co-ordinates
- Regular focus on the four operations
- Daily problem solving across all aspects
- Fractions and decimals

Our themed work for Summer — Ancient Egypt

Science

Animals including humans

Children in Y3 will be learning about light and how it allows us to see. They will be investigating how light travels and what Causes shadows to form and take the shape they do.

There will be some links to the topic with children creating questions they want to find the answer for.

In Summer 2, children will be exploring the idea behind forces with a focus on magnets before finishing the year learning more about plants.

Children will have the opportunity to conduct different enquiries and experiments.

Homework

We will be sending out both maths and English homework on a weekly basis with some other creative homework occasionally given. This will be given on a Friday and will be required to be handed in on a Wednesday.

We also have a goal of ALL children reading at least 3 times a week—this could be reading to an adult or reading independently. We do ask that you sign your child's reading record even if they read independently. Your support with this is hugely important

Computing

Children will be continuing to use computers to develop their understanding of our topic. In addition they will be learning how to do the following skills:

- Simulations
- Debugging programs
- Digital mapping
- Continue to use word processing to record

RE

We will be exploring:

- The many Gods of Ancient Egypt and ways they worshipped
- Why holy books are important
- * What we can learn from symbols
- Why do religions have rules?

History, Geography and Art & Design

- We will again be focussing on history this term. This will encapsulate all other subject areas.
- Tutankhamun—died or murdered?
- * Investigate the River Nile and the land usage and settlement
- How the Egyptians built the pyramids (D.T.
- Creating our own sarcophagus' (painting and drawing)
- Creating canopic jars (sculpture)
- The process of mummification
- * How we can use different sources to create a picture of history









Science Animals including humans

Children in Year 4 will be focussing on electricity in Summer 1. They will be learning about how we use electricity in different appliances and will be creating their own circuits. They will create their own questions that they will investigate and explore different components to make their circuit work.

In Summer 2, they will learn about sound and the phenomenon of how sound travels to our ear and the effect of sound travelling through different materials.

Finally they will be using Classification keys to group together groups of animals.

<u>PE</u>

As usual, Mrs Bell will be teaching Physical Education. PE is every Monday and it is expected that all Children bring a kit.

- * Please ensure your child has a kit suitable for both indoors and outdoors as there will be opportunities for both
- Children will apply skills and tactics suitable for attacking and defending and play competitive games such as hockey and tag rugby.
- * Please note on PE days earrings will not be permitted and should be removed before children come to school or they are able to remove them independently.

<u>PSHE</u>

Although PSHE is a nonstatutory subject, at Lingdale we know that personal, social, health and economic education is vital.

- *PSHE is ongoing and is often addressed through specific lessons as well as aspects of other subjects.
- * Across the year, we will explore anti-bullying, mental health, and family issues.

All of these issues are addressed delicately with the support of Mrs Stephenson.
