Governors' Report

As we start the final term of the 2018/19 school year, it is nice to reflect on some of the achievements since September. Our three new members of teaching staff, Mrs Norris, Miss Stonehouse and Mrs Crame have all settled in well and are well-liked by staff, pupils and parents. It has been a delight to see the many superb displays of pupils' work on the walls of the classrooms as I and other governors have made learning walks around the school. New interactive white boards have been installed in every classroom and it is good to see technology being used to support learning.

From the 2019/20 academic year onwards, all state-funded maintained schools and academies (including free schools) in England will be required to administer an online multiplication tables check (MTC) to year 4 pupils. To help with this, school has also bought into Times Tables Rock Stars which is an app designed to promote speedy recall of all times tables.

I have just finished being the governor responsible for checking that the SATS have been correctly administered and I must congratulate the year six pupils for their attitude and hard work. I expect to be able to report excellent results to you when the results are published around the 9th July. I was also in school to witness Year two children working extremely hard to complete their end of Key Stage tests. The pupils are getting to know me and I often get a cheery, "Hello Mr Whitehead" as I walk round the village.
